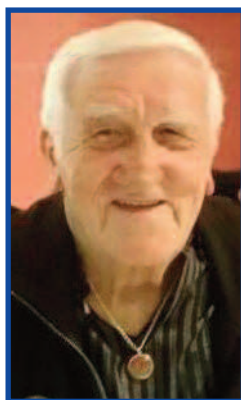

We've been working and planning to ensure we can get the most information to the Delegates attending the Convention. We also encourage each Delegate to bring a guest. The Mandates have been sent, along with the schedule of meetings.

Delegates have a big responsibility, which is why most delegates get financial assistance from their District and/or Society to attend the Convention. Each District should plan to have at least 1 Delegate at each meeting. We strongly suggest all Delegates attend the Long Range Planning meeting on Saturday morning from 9:30 AM to 11 AM. better the Committee will be. We also have 14 Resolutions that will be voted on. All of Your National Officers will be up for re-election. One of the exciting items that we are initiating is a program called SilkStart. This all-in-one computer system will not only assist Societies with Marketing and Communication within their Society, but also with their Districts and the National Office. The National Office is diligently working on rolling the program out to Societies that have recently hosted or will be hosting a National Event.

As you can see, the focus of this article is to stress the importance of our upcoming National Convention. Concordia is going to put on a great event and they will be sharing how they get their members to attend the National Festival, which will be in Fort Wayne, IN in 2019. We look forward to seeing the maximum number of Delegates for each District in Concordia, where we will be planning the future of our Organization. We have been blessed to have had Our Forefathers get us to this point, now it's our responsibility plan for the future.

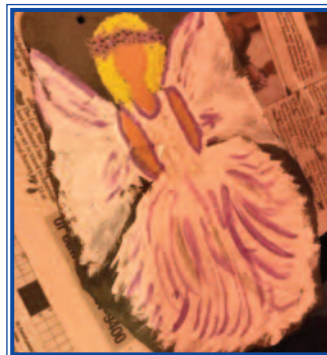
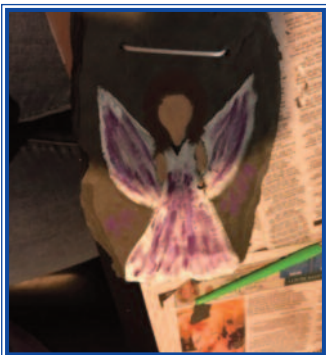

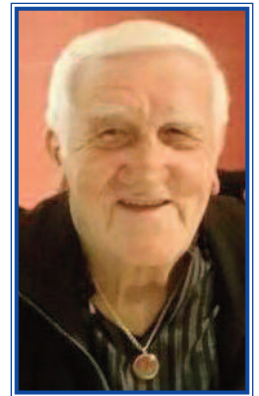
American Foundation for Suicide Prevention

Obituaries



Eldon Zahm

Eldon Zahm, past American Turner President (1986-1990), past Central States District President (1974-1984), and past Fort Wayne Turners President (1974-1977) passed away April 17, 2018 at the age of 92. He joined the American Turners in 1969 and was active at the local, district, and national level. Among other things, Eldon was a prolific writer for the Turner Topics, created the National Turner Princess contest, and helped to put in writing many of the rules American Turners still use today. He designed the National Honor Key ceremonial program (he received his Honor Key in 1991) and the membership cards that we are currently using, standardized per capita reports between American Turners and the districts, incorporated American Turners in 1989, and contacted IUPUI about archiving American Turner records.

For the Central States District, he was influential in getting Indianapolis Athenaeum reactivated and Toledo Turners and South bend Turners added as district societies, designed the Central States District emblem that is still used today, and set up the District constitution and rules for District golf and bowling

At Fort Wayne Turners, Eldon designed, promoted and supervised the construction of the basement that was our barroom for many years and is now meeting room space. He caused the main floor clubroom to be remodeled. He helped with the formation of our highest award given at the local level, the Vorwarts award of which he was a recipient in 1985. During his administration the Fort Wayne Turner Softball league was formed and the first softball diamond was lighted, the 2nd ball diamond was created, and the parking lot was doubled in size. He started the parking program for the 4th of July and Three Rivers Festival Raft Race, the precursor of our current 2nd largest fundraiser, parking for the Johnny Appleseed Festival. He assisted with seven Fort Wayne Turner Princess contests. He instigated the Memorial Room at Fort Wayne Turners.

When not at Turners, Eldon served in the US Army Air Corps as an intelligence instructor for Air-Sea Rescue, served with the Field Division of the FBI, was a real estate broker and home builder, and was honored by the Governor of Indiana as a “Sagamore of the Wabash” and “Kentucky Colonel”. He had six children, seven grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren. His wife of 40 years, Patti, passed away in 1990.

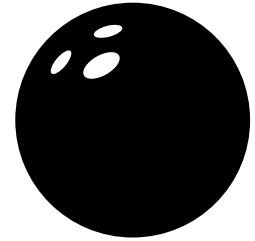

You must not be 18 years of age by July 1st, if you are you would then be eligible for the yearly National Golf event that takes place the second week of July every year.

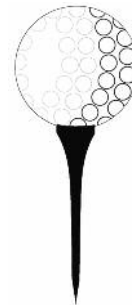

THE BENEFITS OF GIVING

On JANUARY 3, 2018 the Aurora Turners lost a 40-year honorary member in the person of John “Pop-eye” Miles. John had participated in many American Turner National Bowling and Golf tournaments over the years and as has been the case so many times in Turner lore he made a lot of friends from other societies. This in itself is not significant or unusual and continues to happen with each passing generation.

On FEBRUARY 12, 2018 the American Turners Endowment Trust received an unsolicited donation from a group of seven male Turner members from the Clinton, MA society in the amount of several hundred dollars. Again, not unusual but in this instance it was donated in the memory of John “Pop-eye” Miles, a member from a different Turn Verein, in a different state and different Turner District almost 900 miles away. All in the name of friendship developed during years of friendly Turner competition!

Now we are talking slightly unusual, but as Turner National competitions have developed over so many years of active participation in athletic and social events many friendships have developed within our membership that have lasted for years. This donation, in particular, now becomes special in the archives of our Endowment Trust!

This special donation was processed like all others, a confirmation/thankyou was sent and the money deposited into our Endowment Trust account to become a vital part of our total assets that
